Policing from an (inter)national perspective

Monday, 29 March 2021

Background of the project: The research project PluS-i (Pluralisation of local urban security production; June 2017 – May 2022) studies the heterogenous development of local security production in Germany by interdisciplinary and multi-perspective research. Plural policing is defined as a publicly perceived form of security production and maintenance of different distinguishable stakeholders in congruent, overlapping, or continuous areas of competences. Within the research project, five case studies are conducted to analyse the variety of plural policing in bigger cities in Germany. Not only the variety of stakeholders is studied, relations and differences within the production of security are also examined. The goal is to derive practice-oriented opportunities for action while being in constant dialogue with practitioners.

Aim of the event: This PluS-i event aims to obtain a more comprehensive view of plural policing that does not stop at national borders. We specifically invited international colleagues to be introduced to their perspectives on topics such as 'plural policing in Germany's neighbouring countries', 'citizens and policing', and 'public vs. private policing' in order to compare them with the German point of view.
